Unfortunately, it's that time of year again where wasps are becoming more and more active. We have received reports of people being stung up to 30-times by unknowingly bumping into a nest while cleaning their yards/decks.

Wasps and other stinging insects are most active from July through the late summer months of August and September as long as the weather is warm. Wasps are generally more active in the middle of the day when it's warm, and less active between dusk and dawn when temperatures are cooler. Please be very careful and watch your children/pets near decks, shrubs, trees and puddle areas.

If you notice a wasp nest, unless you have the proper equipment and sprays, please keep away. Take a photo (if possible) and email it along with details where it is located directly to margie@inrhodes.com and carly@inrhodes.com so we can get someone out to treat the area and remove the nest.

Residential Lock Box Program

The Royal Oak Fire Department has a unique program that helps both the First Responder and home owner. It's purpose is to expedite access to a citizen's residence and reduce the likelihood of property damage that would be caused by the response team if they had to force their way into a home to answer an emergency call.

A person calling 911 after suffering a fall, heart attack, or stroke might not be able to open their door. When firefighters arrive every second counts and without a lock box they would have to break through a door or window to gain entrance or waste valuable time.

The program is open to Royal Oak residents who live alone or are left alone on a regular basis and have a condition which may result in need of immediate assistance due to being incapacitated or unconscious. Residents that qualify include elderly, physically handicapped or those recovering from major surgery or injury.

Garden Committee Update

The Garden Committee has finished planting for the Summer Season. The five pots at the clubhouse are the responsibility of the Committee and are looking colorful and healthy. Thank you, Keith, for keeping them watered.

In lieu of In Rhodes buying and planting flowers at the entrances of Wickham and Parmenter, the Garden Committee volunteered to do it. They have not faired as well as the pots. There were three issuess working against us:

- 1. The weather has been unusually hot.
- 2. We were delayed in planting because the sprinkling system had to be repaired which meant we had to hold the plants for four weeks.
- 3. According to the soil test done by English Gardens, the alkaline level is high. Clay in the soil may cause this but also road salt can affect the soil. They recommend that we amend the soil with a compound called Mag-I-Cal which we purchased and donated.

Some of the plants at both entrances have been replaced by generous donors.

Many thanks to all the volunteers who helped in the planting and have watched over the plants. We are always looking for people who would like to join us. It was wonderful this week when Anna stepped forward and offered to replace some dead plants with some new ones.

A reminder about our "pets" policy


It's illegal to permit your pet to deposit poop in any place other than the premises where the animal is harbored.
