LONG-TERM PARKING RULES FOR COVENTRY TRAVELERS

Regardless if a resident is planning to travel for a weekend, week, month or longer, it is the residents responsibility to notify management to register and relocate their vehicle to a designated long-term parking space.

The long-term parking policy is not just for the winter months, it is in place all year long. Management cannot halt a vendors schedule because a residents failed to contact management or make arrangements for a friend, neighbor or family member to relocate their vehicle while they are out of town.



If a resident leaves for travel plans without notifying management and relocating their vehicle to long-term parking, their vehicle may be towed and the vehicle owner will be required to retrieve their vehicle from the local vehicle impound yard at the vehicle owners expense.

How do I reserve a designated long-term parking space?

- 1. Contact Management (248) 652-8221 to register your vehicle.
- 2. Provide the make, model and plate number for your vehicle.
- 3. Provide the start date and return date of your travels.
- 4. In the event of an emergency, always leave a spare key to the vehicle with a neighbor, friend or family member. Provide the emergency key holder contact information to management.

Management does not want to tow anyone's vehicles. Please avoid the hassle and towing fees and notify our office before you travel.

As we draw closer to year end, it's a good time to look back at this accomplished Board. We were faced with record high inflation, high interest rates, an increased water rate from the city of Royal Oak, and increase to our natural gas price but we were fortunate to have locked in a multi-year contact with our supplier last year - as well as suppliers seeking increases in their ongoing contracts with Coventry. It was an uphill battle, but this Board was able to provide the following major accomplishments for the community:



- New roofs on 43 condo units
- Major road repairs within our footprint
- Parking lot repairs in specific courts
- Gutter guard installation for the entire complex
- Completion of exterior painting project for the community
- Sidewalk repairs in critical areas
- Tree trimming and removal of diseased trees
- Installation of a key fob system to replace 4 to 5 paid Pool Attendants
- New door installation being done in-house thereby saving thousands of dollars
- Purchase of a Pool Robot to eliminate human labor costs
- Hiring of a new pool company for chemical supplies, as well as open & closing responsibility, saving Coventry \$2000
- Board approval to reestablish our Finance Committee
- Creation of our in-house Maintenance Department thereby eliminating a costly maintenance company effective 5/1/23
- New shower stalls in the ladies shower room
- Painting of clubhouse and installation of new carpeting and card room chairs
- Update of library to include children and young adult sections and new shelving
- Cancellation of contracts of underperforming suppliers
- Acquisition of a 2% back credit card for all Coventry purchases
- Enhancement of wi-fi and phone system performance with a new cable company

We are proud to announce that these significant accomplishments occurred without raising our HOA fees for 2 consecutive years!!

Special thanks to our Maintenance staff, our Committee Chairpersons, our Committee Volunteers, and our Management Rep for another successful year. Best wishes to you and yours for a great holiday season, and looking forward to 2024.

Work In Progress at Coventry

As winter approaches, most of our exterior projects are winding down.

- Belbot will be doing the final fall cleanup the week of December 4.
- The Solar light testing is ongoing to determine how these lights perform with the shorter daylight hours and in cloudy weather. We are also evaluating the amount of light being put out by the fixtures. The shortest days of the year will be next month so a better understanding may be reached at that time.
- Branch Tree Service will be on site doing treatments on specific trees for a variety issues.
- Coventry onsite maintenance has blown leaves and debris off the gutter guards throughout the property. Later in the season, they will revisit the areas where trees had not shed all of their leaves to make sure there is no obstruction.
