The name of this Coventry ParkHomes multi-medal winner is Kelly Ambrose, who was born blind with only slight vision in one eye.

Eunice Kennedy, Sister of President John F. Kenney, founded the Special Olympics in 1968 to positively change the attitudes towards people with disabilities.



Kelly's Olympic journey began at the 1979 Special Olympics in Mt. Pleasant, Michigan where she won two Gold Medals in Track and a Silver Medal in Gymnastics.



Kelly Ambrose 1979 Special Olympics, Mt. Pleasant, MI Kelly attended and graduated from Groves High School in 1985. During her high school years, Kelly won two trophies in track (1980), and multiple bowling trophies over the years as well.

At age 49, Kelly ran her first 5k race for her age group where she won a bronze medal. She continues to hold the title of former Olympian.

In 1993 Kelly purchased her Condo in Coventry where she continues to reside. You can usually find Kelly either walking through the community or enjoying the pool on a beautiful summer day.

Coventry is proud to have this Special Olympian living in our community.

Wow what a great summer we had! As it comes to a close so does our pool season. We were able to keep the pool open until Sept. 23 this year due to the stretch of days in the 80's that lasted most of September.

The Board just approved the 2025 Budget and I am happy to say there will be no HOA increase this year. The efforts of our on-site maintenance staff have saved us a lot of money by being able to handle numerous work orders rather than having to job them to outside contractors. Thank you Chuck & Josh!

When our annual Management contract with In Rhodes Management expires 12/31/2024, Coventry will enter into a new Management structure. We are hiring a full time on-site Community Manager who will handle the business affairs of the association and we will contract with In Rhodes Management for back office support such as accounting, records keeping, HR and other support services to make this transition as seamless as possible.

There won't be a lot of changes from the Co-Owner perspective. Your HOA payments will still be handled the way they are currently. Workorders and Modification requests will still be sent to the In Rhodes email address but instead of being handled by an In Rhodes employee, they will be routed to our On-Site Community Manager to assign to our in-house maintenance or book a contractor if required.

There will be more information about this coming out as we get closer to year end and implementation of this hybrid-management program.

Our new Community Manager will be on site soon and will spend the next 3 months training, learning our bylaws and shadowing Margie to be prepared for her new assignment. Be sure to look for her introduction article in the November issue of "The Caller.

Don't Forget to Winterize Your Outdoor Faucet

• Fall is here, and Co-owners often forget to winterize their outdoor water faucet before the temperature drops.

Outdoor faucets are not insulated, which allows cold air to seep into the walls of your home. Leaving your outdoor faucet exposed can result in water freezing in the pipes within your exterior walls causing serious damage and costly repairs to your unit.

Co-owners are responsible for winterizing their outdoor water faucet annually. Below are instructions on how to winterize an outdoor water faucet/spigot:



- 1) Turn off the water supply: Turn off the valve that supplies water to the outdoor faucet (located in your basement near the water spigot)
- Disconnect hoses: Disconnect any hoses or attachments from the faucet and store inside your unit for winter.
- Drain the faucet: Open the spigot to drain any remaining water. You can leave the spigot open for a few hours.
- 4) Install a cover: Put a cold-weather cover over the faucet and secure it tightly. (see photos to purchase under \$5 at Home Depot, Lowes or any local hardware store)
- Insulate pipes: Wrap exposed pipes with foam insulation or towels to reduce the risk of freezing.
- 6) Check the shutoff valve: If water continues to trickle out of the faucet after draining, you may need to tighten the interior shutoff valve.

If you are unable to locate your water shut-off valve in the basement, please email: **workorders@inrhodes.com** so maintenance can schedule a visit to assist you.
